RULES & REGULATIONS

Health Requirements for Cattle

1. GENERAL: Health Certificates will be issued without charge by veterinarians of the Health of Animal Division, Canada Department of Agriculture who will make all necessary examinations and conduct the required tests.
2. Any animal suffering from Pink Eye, or Ring Worm will not be admitted to the grounds, or if admitted through oversight, on discovery of same, shall forthwith be removed.
3. The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being unethical in the show ring of Registered Dairy Cattle. (Code of Ethics for Dairy Shows)
 - misrepresenting the age of the animal for the Class in which is shown
 - balancing the udder by any means other than leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters
 - treating the udder, internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation
 - minimize the effects of crampiness by feeding or injecting drugs
 - surgery of any kind performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
 - insertion of foreign material/articles under the skin, into the topline or on the feet.
 - criticizing or interfering with the Judge, show management or other Exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or show.

CLOSED to Northumberland County. Trophies presented at the conclusion of judging each Class and photographer will be present.

All Holsteins exhibited must be registered (at least 75% pure) with the Holstein Association of Canada in the name of the Exhibitor. Animals to be ready at 10:00 a.m. for identification by Holstein representative. All registration papers must be available for inspection and will be checked before the show.

There will be no production certificates required for any of the classes with the exception of **Class #22, HIGHEST BCA, PLACING 1st, 2nd or 3rd.** Any animals eligible for this class will require proof of production to Holstein Representative at Grand Champion selection time.

For milking females, the points from first to fifth are 20, 18, 16, 14, 12. For junior females and dry cows, points are 10, 9, 8, 7, 6.

The maximum total eligible exhibits from a breeding unit is 10 head for Campbellford Fair sponsored classes. As many as two may be added to this if they are 4-H exhibits but additional 4-H entries may not be used to make up Breeder's Herd. There are additional classes sponsored by Northumberland Holstein Club, with no restrictions on the number of entries per class.

In order for herds with CHAH status or herds working towards leucosis free status to meet health regulations, Barn #5 (barn rented by Art Nelson) will be reserved for these exhibitors. The CSAS would like to reserve the "Warkworth" Barn #9 for milking purposes only. In order to avoid any difficulties, all exhibitors must check with the Committee members identified above before unloading.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. There must be at least three exhibitors and at least 24 animals to receive the prize money stated. Otherwise one-half of the stipulated amount will be paid in any class to any exhibitor.
2. All purebred, fullblood, registered animals, whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly) are considered to be the production of the farm or Breeding Unit on which they are maintained.
3. In each classification where the same or common interests are involved in more than one breeding operation, such operations are considered as one Breeding Unit.
4. One entry per Class is eligible from such farm or Breeding Unit, except two entries per class in a maximum of three classes. Each Breeding Unit is allowed 10 exhibits, excluding Breeder's Herd and Get-of-Sire.
5. All entries must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor. All animals, including natural, purebred calves, must be tattooed distinctly before exhibition. The tattoo must be clearly legible.
6. All Certificates of Registration may be checked prior to the beginning of the Breeder's Herd and Get-of-Sire sections. No photocopies of Certification of Registration will be accepted as proof of registration. Original certificates must be presented.
7. Any animal infected with contagious diseases will not be permitted in the barns and are not eligible to show.

1. All competitors must be 4-H members in the current year and reside in Northumberland, Prince Edward, Hastings, Durham East or Peterborough Counties.
2. No entry fees.
3. *Northumberland County's Show ring Dress Code

Purpose of a Dress Code: While promoting professionalism inside the show ring, a dress code in the 4-H livestock division would also serve to provide uniformity among 4-H members. It would abolish the ability to differentiate between clubs and members of the same county.

Dairy: The dress code for 4-H members showing dairy calves in Northumberland County is as follows:

- white pants -preferably with a belt
- hard soled boots or shoes
- white (long or short) sleeved shirt. It is acceptable to have the 4-H logo over the left breast. Other than that, there is to be NO printing on the shirt - this includes names, sponsor's logos and club names.

Beef: The dress code for 4-H members showing a beef animal in Northumberland County is as follows:

- Hard soled boots
- Collared shirt, show ring appropriate
- Club shirts are recommended at the CLUB level ONLY
- The use of farm and breed promotion shirts are to be prohibited in the 4-H beef ring.

4. **Proof of Liability Insurance is required for all livestock exhibited; this must accompany the exhibitor to the Fair. Please complete the Insurance Company section of entry form.**
5. At least three 4-H Clubs must be represented in each class for prize money to be awarded.
6. Livestock must be in the member's 2009 4-H project and tied in the designated area.
7. Exhibitors in each livestock class will be identified with numbered hat bands which must be worn.
8. Numbered Classes will be judged on the group system of placing, unless otherwise specified in the Prize List: All exhibitors will receive \$5 at ringside.
9. The Committee-In-Charge reserves the right to make adjustments to the program when need arises.
10. **Health Requirement. No proof of Brucellosis testing will be required. However, animals showing signs of ringworm, warts, or other diseases will not be allowed to show.**
11. The 4-H project must be satisfactorily completed before the prize money and/or trophies will be awarded.

Each year the Campbellford-Seymour Agricultural Society sponsors a Field Crop competition. Prize money is awarded for the top three placings in each class.

This competition has an "Open Class" and a "4-H Class", which is restricted to 4-H members. All Exhibitors in the Open Class must purchase an Exhibitor Pass (to be surrendered at the gate) for \$10.00, which also allows **one day only free admission** to the Fair. This fee is to be mailed with the entry form.

There is no fee for the 4-H Class. However, 4-H members exhibiting in the Open Class must purchase a \$10.00 Exhibitor's Pass and not enter the exhibit in the 4-H Class as well.

The 4-H Section exhibitor with the highest overall point score in all 4-H Classes will receive a plaque from the Campbellford-Seymour Agricultural Society in addition to cash and other prizes. Exhibitors must write their 4-H Club name on the entry form and entry tags.

The Open Class exhibitor with the highest overall point score will receive the **Lorne McKeown Memorial Trophy**.

NOTE: All samples for both Open and 4-H Classes are to be registered with the Society and on display in the arena no later than 12 noon on the Friday of the Fair.
