# **HOMECRAFT RULES & REGULATIONS**

- All entries must be in place by 12 NOON on Friday August 9<sup>th</sup>
- Entries must be placed in the Curling Club in its proper section ready for the judges between:

6 pm- 8 pm on Thursday August 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024 OR 9 am- 12 NOON on Friday August 9<sup>th</sup>, 2024

- Everything will be done to protect exhibits as far as possible. The Board will not be responsible for any loss to exhibitors.
- Only one entry per exhibitor per class.
- All articles in Homecraft must be strictly the product of the exhibitor.
- All grains, garden and orchard products must be grown on the exhibitor's premises during the past season unless specified.
- No exhibits are to be removed until 4:00 PM on Sunday August 11<sup>th</sup>
- NEW- Prize Money can be picked up from the Fair Office during pick up on Sunday August 11<sup>th</sup> after 4pm.

#### **ENTRY TAGS**

Entry tags must be attached to each item you are exhibiting. Please have your entry tags completed and attached to your exhibits before arriving at the Curling Club.

- All baking MUST be put into plastic bags, and on suitably sized white disposable plates, trays or covered cardboard unless otherwise specified. NO PLASTIC WRAP
- Yeast breads may be exhibited on wicker plates and in baskets. **NO** high handles
- Pie Plates **MUST** be aluminum foil
- NO mixes unless specified
- Papers **MUST** be removed from muffins
- Baking will be judged using "Homecraft Judging Standards for Ontario Fairs".
- ATTENTION NEW EXHIBITORS: Entry tags must be clearly marked "New Exhibitor" in the portion of the tag that is closed. A new exhibitor is one who has not exhibited Baking in Campbellford Fair in the past 5 years.

#### **BAKING TIPS**

YEAST BREADS: Should be well proportioned in size and shape. Golden brown top and bottom, Crust- tender and crisp, no cracks. Inside- sweet nutty flavour and aroma, no large holes. Buns Attached, Rolls Separate COOKIES: Uniform size, 2-2 ½" in diameter, even colour on top and bottom CAKES: Evenly risen, golden brown crust, uniform thickness of layers. Insidefine, even grain, tender, slightly moist. Completely iced unless otherwise instructed

**PIES/TARTS:** Even, golden brown crust, no burnt edges, attractive edging, flaky tender crust, well baked, bottom not soggy or burnt

**FILLING:** Flavour characteristics to type of filling, sufficient thickness to hold shape

### **Notes for exhibiting Needlecraft:**

- ATTENTION NEW EXHIBITORS: Entry tags must be clearly marked "New Exhibitor" in the portion of the tag that is closed. A new exhibitor is one who has not exhibited in Needlecraft in Campbellford Fair in the past 5 years.
- All entries to be placed by 12 noon the Friday of the Fair
- Articles showing signs of wear or soiled will be disqualified
- Quilts may be shown 3 years, all other items 2 years
- ALL QUILTS TO BE HAND QUILTED UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED
- Markings of identification on quilts (i.e. initials) must be covered until after judging
- NO "For Sale" signs allowed until after judging
- NO quilt kits allowed in regular sections
- O.A.A.S HAND QUILT RULE SUMMARY- A quilt must measure at least 324" on the perimeter to qualify for the Grand and Reserve Grand Prizes and to go to the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Competitions.

# OAAS HAND QUILTED QUILT COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### **Rules:**

- 1. The quilt must be solely made, and hand quilted by the exhibitor.
- 2. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. All 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement.
- 3. The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) and not be mounted on a frame. The quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.
- 4. The winning OAAS Hand Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future OAAS fair, district and/or provincial competitions.
- 5. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules.
- 6. Each local fair is entitled to send their best of show of all eligible hand quilts to the district competition.
- 7. If the fair's best of show hand quilt has won at more than one fair, the exhibitor must consider their own agricultural society as the one from which the quilt will be sent to the district meeting, otherwise it should be sent



- from the agricultural society nearest his/her home address. The other fairs at which this quilt was entered and won, may enter their second best of show hand quilt into the district competition.
- 8. An exhibitor who wins more than one best of show title with different hand quilts at different fairs is entitled to enter each winning quilt in the district competition.
- 9. If an exhibitor is exhibiting in more than one district, they are entitled to enter different winning quilts at different district competitions but cannot enter the same quilt at more than one district competition.
- 10. The OAAS will award a ribbon to exhibitors of winning hand quilts at each district competition.

# OAAS MACHINE-QUILTED QUILT COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### **Rules:**

- 1. The quilt must be solely made, and machine quilted by the exhibitor.
- 2. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. All 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement.



- 3. The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) and not be mounted on a frame. The quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.
- 4. The winning OAAS Machine Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future OAAS fair, district and/or provincial competitions.
- 5. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules.
- 6. The use of domestic, mid arm and/or long arm equipment is permitted on hand or computer guided machine quilt entries.
- 7. Each local fair is entitled to send their best of show of all eligible machine quilts to the district competition.
- 8. If the fair's best of show machine quilt has won at more than one fair, the exhibitor must consider their own agricultural society as the one from which the quilt will be sent to the district meeting, otherwise it should be sent from the agricultural society nearest his/her home address. The other fairs at which this quilt was entered and won, may enter their second best of show hand quilt into the district competition.
- 9. An exhibitor who wins more than one best of show title with different machine quilts at different fairs is entitled to enter each winning quilt in the district competition.
- 10. If an exhibitor is exhibiting in more than one district, they are entitled to enter different winning quilts at different district competitions but cannot enter the same quilt at more than one district competition.
- 11. The OAAS will award a ribbon to exhibitors of winning machine quilts at each district competition.
