## HEMOCRAFT RULES & REGULATIONS

- All entries must be in place by 12 NOON on Friday August 7<sup>th</sup>
- Entries must be placed in the Curling Club in its proper section ready for the judges between:  
**6 pm- 8 pm on Thursday August 6<sup>th</sup>, 2026 OR**  
**9 am- 12 NOON on Friday August 7<sup>th</sup>, 2026**
- Everything will be done to protect exhibits as far as possible. The Board will not be responsible for any loss to exhibitors.
- Only one entry per exhibitor per class.
- All articles in Homecraft must be strictly the product of the exhibitor.
- All grains, garden and orchard products must be grown on the exhibitor's premises during the past season unless specified.
- **No exhibits are to be removed until 5:00 PM on Sunday August 9<sup>th</sup> - NOTE: NEW TIME FOR 2026**
- **Prize Money can be picked up at the Homecraft Quilt Draw table or the Fair Office Saturday and Sunday of the fair.**

**General Appearance-** natural colour, not cloudy, uniform & medium sized pieces, clean & clear container, sealed

**Texture-** Pickles- firm, yet tender, not overcooked, smooth syrup

**Relishes-** Uniform pieces

**Flavour & Aroma-** pleasing; no off odours or mustiness

**Please note: No food colouring to be used**

#### Tips for Jams, Jellies & Marmalades

**General Appearance-** colour natural, even distribution of fruit, clean container, sealed. Jelly- Clear

**Texture-** Jam: Soft, spreadable, no separation of fruit and juice. Jelly: Retains shape, not gummy/sticky/rubbery; smooth, shiny cut edge.

Marmalade: must have at least 1 (one) citrus fruit of juice

**Flavour-** natural fruit flavour

**Disqualified if not sealed**

### **BAKING TIPS-Read Carefully**

#### **YEAST BREADS:**

- well proportioned in size and shape.
- Golden brown top and bottom,
- Crust-tender and crisp, no cracks, no large holes.
- Buns Attached, Rolls Separate

#### **COOKIES:**

- Uniform size, 2 – 2 ½" in diameter
- even colour on top and bottom

#### **CAKES:**

- Evenly risen, uniform thickness of layers.
- Inside-fine, even grain, tender, slightly moist.
- Completely iced unless otherwise instructed
- Icing – icing or confectioner's sugar and liquid
- Glaze – sugar and liquid, very thin

#### **PIES/TARTS:**

- golden brown crust, attractive edging,
- flaky tender crust, well baked,
- bottom not soggy or burnt.
- sufficient thickness of filling to hold shape

### **Notes for exhibiting Needlecraft:**

- **All entries to be placed by 12 noon the Friday of the Fair**
- Articles showing signs of wear or soiled will be disqualified
- Quilts may be shown 3 years, all other items 2 years. **Please indicate on the entry tag if your quilt has been quilted by another person** (entry allowed, but does not qualify for Grand and Reserve- i.e. cannot move on to the District/Provincial Competition).
- Markings of identification on quilts (i.e. initials) must be covered until after judging
- **NO** quilt kits allowed in regular sections
- **UPDATED SIZE REQUIREMENT 2026- O.A.A.S HAND QUILT RULE SUMMARY- A quilt must be solely made and quilted by the exhibitor and measure at least 280" on the perimeter to qualify for the Grand and Reserve Grand Prizes and to go to the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Competitions.**

### **OAAS HAND QUILTED QUILT COMPETITION** **ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS**

#### **Rules:**

1. The quilt must be solely made, and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
2. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 280 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. All 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement.
3. The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) and not be mounted on a frame. The quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.



4. The winning OAAS Hand Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future OAAS fair, district and/or provincial competitions.
5. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules.

**District Competition**

6. Each local fair is entitled to send their best of show of all eligible hand quilts to the district competition.
7. If the fair's best of show hand quilt has won at more than one fair, the exhibitor must consider their own agricultural society as the one from which the quilt will be sent to the district meeting, otherwise it should be sent from the agricultural society nearest his/her home address. The other fairs at which this quilt was entered and won, may enter their second best of show hand quilt into the district competition.
8. An exhibitor who wins more than one best of show title with different hand quilts at different fairs is entitled to enter each winning quilt in the district competition.
9. If an exhibitor is exhibiting in more than one district, they are entitled to enter different winning quilts at different district competitions but cannot enter the same quilt at more than one district competition.
10. The OAAS will award a ribbon to exhibitors of winning hand quilts at each district competition.

**OAAS MACHINE-QUILTED QUILT COMPETITION**  
**ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS**

**Rules:**

1. The quilt must be solely made, and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
2. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 280 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. All 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement.
3. The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) and not be mounted on a frame. The quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.
4. The winning OAAS Machine Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future OAAS fair, district and/or provincial competitions.
5. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules.
6. The use of domestic, mid arm and/or long arm equipment is permitted on hand or computer guided machine quilt entries.



**District Competition**

7. Each local fair is entitled to send their best of show of all eligible machine quilts to the district competition.
8. If the fair's best of show machine quilt has won at more than one fair, the exhibitor must consider their own agricultural society as the one from which the quilt will be sent to the district meeting, otherwise it should be sent from the agricultural society nearest his/her home address. The other fairs at which this quilt was entered and won, may enter their second best of show machine quilt into the district competition.
9. An exhibitor who wins more than one best of show title with different machine quilts at different fairs is entitled to enter each winning quilt in the district competition.
10. If an exhibitor is exhibiting in more than one district, they are entitled to enter different winning quilts at different district competitions but cannot enter the same quilt at more than one district competition.
11. The OAAS will award a ribbon to exhibitors of winning machine quilts at each district competition.

9. **Quilt- Machine Quilted** (by home sewer, **not** professional). Any size but must be 280" on the perimeter and quilted by exhibitor to be eligible for Grand Champion Machine Quilt prize \*\*Please indicate on entry tag if quilted by another.

10. **GRAND CHAMPION MACHINE QUILTED QUILT** – eligible if 280" on the perimeter, made and **Machine-Quilted** by the exhibitor (not on long arm machine) from classes 1,2,4,5, 8 and 9.

*Prizes: \$50*

11. **RESERVE CHAMPION MACHINE QUILTED QUILT** – Eligible as for Class 10.

*Prizes: \$25*
